There is possibly more to the above photograph than meets the eye. When the photo is enlarged, the man in the centre of the picture appears to be Sir John Monash. It is known, that Sir John often accompanied newspaper reporters (and other 'influential people') on the steam train to view the work at the Yallourn Project (as is shown in the photograph below).
